Choose your readings for Mass from the lists on the following pages. You can read the full passage in your bible or go to usccb.org – the books of the bible can be found there.

<u>Pick 1</u> from the Old Testament (1st Reading) list and unless funeral will be after Easter and before Pentecost, we suggest you choose from the Outside Easter Time column. <u>Pick 1</u> from the New Testament (2nd reading) list <u>Pick 1</u> from the Gospel list

Music Options are included on following pages.

Pick 1 from each: (a) entrance/gathering, (b) responsorial Psalm (c) preparation of the gifts, (d) communion, (e) recession/closing/postlude.

Note: While Funeral music may express "convictions and feelings" its subject must always be the paschal mystery and it must be related to the readings from Scripture. Rather than adopting popular secular songs which are inappropriate to a liturgical setting, we should seek out good liturgical music on a paschal theme. Option: secular music at Wake/Funeral Home. Order of Christian Funerals with Cremation Rite.

Eulogy: Eulogy may not be longer than 5 minutes (eulogy is not a requirement); must be emailed 24 hours prior to funeral to the Funeral Ministry for approval by the Priest. The Eulogy is not part of Mass. We suggest that the Eulogy be read at Wake, or it may be read before Mass or after final Blessings at the Mass. The Eulogy does not have to be read/presented by the family member or friend. A Eulogy is <u>not</u> a resume. It may be submitted to the Priest/Deacon to be used at his discretion to incorporate some points of interest into the homily.

• Scriptures for Catholic funerals...scriptures/readings which are liturgically correct and appropriate for Christian funerals.

• usccb.org...US Conference of Catholic Bishops...another good source of scriptures/readings for Catholic funerals.


