BIBLE STUDY HISTORY

1991-2002 11 yrs

After attending an interfaith Bible Study in MA., and moving to Tampa in 1989, I sorely missed the classes and wanted more. Since the 70's reading and listening to and how our Lord spoke to me through Scripture brought me greater peace and intimacy. God and I, our friendship began. As an early riser, faithfully awake at 4:20 a.m., I would get up and read my Bible and listen. One morning it was **Isaiah 55** - "**Come, all you who are thirsty, come...**" *"Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the waters; and you who have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without cost. Why spend money on what is not bread, and your labor on what does not satisfy?"*

I met with our Pastor, Fr. Dennis Hughes (now MSGR) and after sharing my story of wanting a "Catholic" Bible Study, he gave me the go ahead with his support but to find someone to do it with me! Yikes! Frazzled, I continued to pray.

That prompted me to go forth with Bible Study at St Timothy. Our parish was just starting out and struggling so a fee was mentioned. NO way, scripture said "without money." And so, it always was, no fee to learn the love of God! Time to give back to St Timothy parishioners.

It was in bringing communion to the nursing home that I met our connection. I shared with this patient that I was looking for someone with Scripture Study background. Instantly she gave me the name of another friend who visited her weekly, Rita Dennis. Rita already does Bible Study at St. Paul's, she tells me. Ten minutes later, Yup, Rita walks in! Where is God in THAT!!!

After she agreed to help us, I chose a few parishioners and 12 of us met at my house. Now time and dates? I placed a memo in our bulletin, with a sign-up to be returned of how many would be interested in joining Bible Study and what days? It came back **unanimous**. Tuesday morning at 10 a.m. and Wednesday evening at 7:30 p.m. and so it began. I led this ministry for 10 years. 1991 to 2001-2002. (I left because I was going to be a Nana)

What I loved the most? I loved attending to both morning and evening classes! GIFT! It was knowing how many other people loved God and scripture as much as I did! How we all see God so alive everyday but also in scripture, our intimacy with God through scripture. Our God of the living! One of the things I appreciate in the many years is being a at a different table every year and meeting so many spiritual friends and listening how God spoke to them in the lesson. I am not sure when we had to switch the evening classes from Wednesday to Tuesday night.

I am deeply appreciative to both Bill Lynn and Diane for weekly working so hard nourishing us so well in Scripture. Thank you so very much for your continued dedication and hard work bringing this for us.

I only missed one year of Bible study because of my open- heart surgery. Then came Jan Kennedy.... Thank you, Jan!
