Lesson 17- 2 Kings 8:16-10:26 The Beginning of the End of Israel.

In our last lesson we saw how strong Elisha's powers of prophecy were. He was able to warn the king of Israel about where and when the Arameans/Syrians would attack so Israel could avoid an encounter with them. Also in our last lesson, a severe famine plagued Israel and the armies of Aram/Syria blockaded the city of Samaria, in an attempt to starve the Israelites into surrender. This plan was thwarted when the LORD put fear in the hearts of Aram, and the army abandoned their camp, leaving all their provisions behind for Israel to enjoy. At the end of our last lesson, Elisha is called to anoint a new king for Aram. A vision told Elisha that Hazael, the man he was to anoint, would be king but he would also be responsible for burning down fortresses and killing women and children of Israel with great brutality. Hazael, after hearing he would be king, smothered the ill King Ben-Hadad to quicken his own ascension to the throne.

When you get there, anoint Hazael king over Aram. ¹⁶ Also, anoint Jehu son of Nimshi king over Israel, and anoint Elisha son of Shaphat from Abel Meholah to succeed you as prophet. ¹⁷ Jehu will put to death any who escape the sword of Hazael, and Elisha will put to death any who escape the sword of Jehu. ¹⁸ Yet I reserve seven thousand in Israel—all whose knees have not bowed down to Baal and whose mouths have not kissed him."
